Notes of Guidance

Appeals relating to the standard and/or the content of an examination paper.

Any appeal relating to the standard or content of an examination paper should be referred to IAMI for transmission to SQA/MCA. All such appeals must be made through the Head of Centre/Department or nominated deputy and must be received by SQA within one month of the examination.

Appeals against examination results.

Prior to their issue, all examination results are scrutinised and approved by an MCA Examiner. The decision of the MCA Examiner is final. It is possible for candidates to request an administrative check on their papers. A fee is charged for this service - this is refundable if an error is detected. The request for an administrative check must be received within eight weeks of the results being issued. Examination scripts are exempt from the Data Protection Act (2018) - Requests for access to personal data and will not be released under the terms of this Act.
